I am writing this letter to let you know that Beaufort Middle School has been designated as a Targeted Support & Improvement Additional Targeted Support (TSI-AT) school by the North Carolina State Board of Education. Per ESSA Section 1111(d)(2), schools are identified as TSI-AT schools in North Carolina because one or more of the following subgroups received a subgroup performance grade score at or below the highest identified CSI-LP school's All Students group during the identification year; and is on the TSI-CU list for the subgroup(s) for the previous year. Subgroup performance scores are provided for the following subgroups: (1) Students with Disabilities, (2) Economically Disadvantaged, (3) Black, (4) White, (5) Hispanic, (6) Asian-Pacific Islander, (7) Multi-racial, and (8) English Learners. This letter is to notify our parents and guardians of Beaufort Middle School's intentions to improve educational outcomes for underperforming student subgroups and close achievement gaps for all students.

As a TSI-AT (ATSI) school, Beaufort Middle School is required to develop an Additional Targeted Support and Improvement (ATSI) plan that specifically addresses how the school will improve outcomes for underperforming subgroups. The plan will also include strategies that our district or charter will employ to support Beaufort Middle School's improvement efforts. The ATSI plan will address the following areas:

We have set the following goal for Beaufort Middle School:

• BMS will demonstrate an average annual increase of at least 5% in the proficiency and growth indices as measured by EVAAS for Students With Disabilities.

Here are some strategies that we will be implementing to improve student outcomes:

- Increasing collaborative planning time between core and EC teachers to develop and implement lessons designed to meet individual student needs
- Identifying staff members to attend MTSS training
- Providing opportunities for grade level/content partner department meeting planning
- Designing targeted support provided for students through WIN/WIT time
- Providing appropriate lessons for individualized practice for students
- Recruiting and retaining highly qualified staff in all positions
- Developing multi-tiered systems of support (MTSS) plans for students with learning needs
- Providing ongoing staff development and implementation of district literacy initiatives:
 - o Leveraging Literacy
 - Keys to Literacy Comprehension
 - o Implementing Major Clarity to connect student interests and strengths to future career opportunities

- Monitor the progress your child is making and attend meetings with your child's teacher(s).
